Section G: Historical Cultivars (Introduced before 1976)
Section H: English Box – Designed as a means of displaying collections of single flowers without stem, foliage or the presence of buds. The entire emphasis is on the beauty of each individual blossom. **For this Show:** Irises of complimentary colors all within the same classification, exhibitor's choice. The display boxes are on loan from the Kirkwood Iris Society.
Section I: Collections – Three stalks of seedlings or named cultivars of same classification, exhibitor's choice. May be all the same or different cultivars displayed in a vase provided by the exhibitor.
Section J: Display Only
Single stalk of an iris that is unknown and cannot be identified, or stalks arriving too late to be entered for judging. No AIS awards are given in this section.
Section K: Show Judges Entries
Iris stalks of any class entered by a judge requested to judge this show.
Appropriate AIS ribbons and a Best of Section will be determined by Host Chapter judges. Not eligible for general show awards such as Best Seedling or Best of Show or Silver or Bronze medals.

AN IRIS CRUISE

- Class 1: "The Sunny Caribbean" - Use warm colors in this design staged on a table against a black background, 32" tall X 22" wide X 15" deep.
MAXIMUM HEIGHT 31" 4 ENTRIES
- Class 2: "The Alaskan Shoreline" - A suggestion of ice would be nice for this design staged on a table against a black background, 32" tall X 22" wide X 15" deep.
MAXIMUM HEIGHT 31" 4 ENTRIES
- Class 3: "The Mississippi Queen" - Cruise from New Orleans to St. Louis and use decorative wood in this design staged on a table against a green background 32" tall X 22" wide X 15" deep.
MAXIMUM HEIGHT 31" 4 ENTRIES
- Class 4: "The Captain's Table" - A functional dinner for two staged on a 32" X 32" X 32" table furnished by the show committee. Table covering and place settings must be furnished by the exhibitor.
MAXIMUM HEIGHT 16" CENTER or 18" CORNER 4 ENTRIES
- Class 5: "A Disney Cruise" - What fun! What a cast of characters! Use an accessory with this design staged on a table against a frosty green background 20 tall X 14" wide X 15" deep.
YOUTH ONLY, MAXIMUM HEIGHT 19 1/2" 6 ENTRIES
- Class 6: "Scuba Diving" - Check out the reef as you create this design staged on a table against a black background 20" tall X 14" wide X 15" deep.
